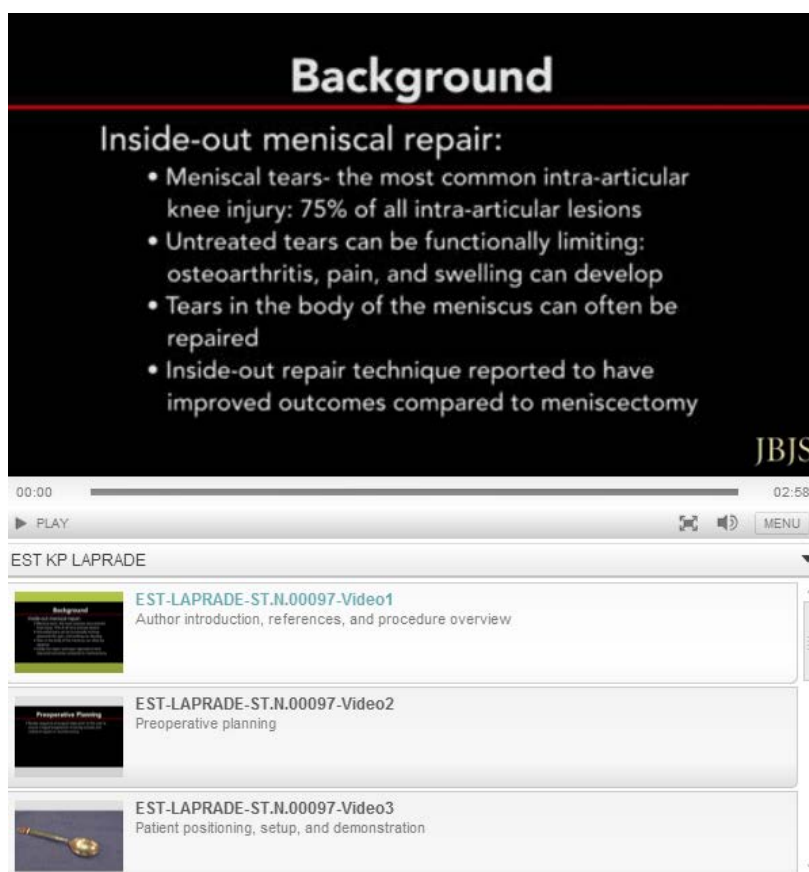


# Essential Surgical Techniques Key Procedures: Video File List

## Instructions

*Key Procedures articles require a separate video file for each substantive segment. This enables viewers to click on the portion they want to see without having to watch the entire video, as in the following example:*
